Originally established in 1994, the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency was established as a Sovereign Entity and Specialized Agency to create and implement a more equitable method for the distribution and supply of wealth among all of the peoples of the world in accordance and compliance with the instruments set forth as International Treaties. These include the Bretton Woods Conference, the Treaty of Versailles, the original Charter of the United Nations, the original Charter of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (Now known more commonly as the World Bank) and the original Charter of the International Monetary Fund. This revision is dated December 8th of the year 2014 and supersedes any and all previous revisions.

ARTICLE 1 – PURPOSES

The purposes of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency are to

- (I) establish and implement a global approach to the Division, Creation and Distribution of wealth in an equitable manner so as to prevent the consolidation of power and/or wealth in any individual, nation, corporation or single, corporeal entity.
- (II) insure that the implementation of such Economic Reform will purchase out the existing debt created, fueled and sustained by the Centralized Banking System, the Fractional Economic System and the Debt-Based Economic Structure and will be utilized in such a manner as to prevent the spread and division of wealth in accordance with personal, individual, national and/or any other form of corporeal entity.
- (III) provide an equitable manner for the individual distribution of wealth in the form of loans, assurances, guarantees and other financial instruments as may be made available for the purposes of education, housing, environmental concerns, medical and health and in other manners as may be available to end poverty, hunger and homelessness and to insure peaceful accords between different nations, states and kingdoms.
- (IV) to provide grants to individuals and/or organizations for the purposes of establishing infrastructure and/or in order to combat the negative impacts of poverty on a local, national or global scale including education, medical and health, environmental concerns, housing, hunger and homelessness and other such concerns as may exist to alleviate poverty on a global scale.
- (V) to establish individuals, agencies, companies, corporations and/or other corporeal entities strategically around the globe with the means to and for the purposes of combating the adverse impact of poverty including homelessness, hunger, environmental concerns, medical and health and education and any and all other such concerns as must be readily addressed to raise the standards of living and opportunity for the impoverished around the globe.

(VI) to establish a central global facility/community whose primary goal and function is the coordination of global, national and local facility/communities on a Global Scale for the express purposes of eradicating the negative impacts of poverty on people around the globe in such a manner so as not to hinder but to extend personal freedoms to include the benefits of financial and social freedom free from poverty, hunger, environmental concerns, homelessness and incapable of obtaining a viable education and/or adequate access to medical and other healthcare facilities and any and all other concerns as may need to be addressed in order to raise the standard of living and opportunities for the impoverished classes.

(VII) to establish a centralized Global Debt and Storage Facility and a separate and independent Bullion Bank for the purposes of a the storage of physical and electronic assets and/or other financial instruments as may be required by law and in accordance with International Treaties and/or for the purposes of providing a more equitable global economic infrastructure and to serve as a Global Debt Facility to insure the stability and a more equitable distribution of wealth among all of the peoples of the world and for the purchase of any and all toxic assets and debt as currently exists in the world. Such purposes shall include special considerations as and for the express purposes of ending global poverty.

(VIII)to establish a global infrastructure, strategically located facilities and other such supplies, facilities, personnel and/or financial holdings as may be necessary for the purposes of a global, Natural Disaster Response effort to include such materials, goods and services as may be required to adequately prepare for Disaster Mitigation and Disaster Response.

(IX) to establish a global security force(s) both physical and electronic in nature and sufficient in size, force and training so as to safeguard and protect such facilities and other infrastructure as may be needed in the concerted effort to eradicate the negative impact of poverty on society and the peoples of the world globally, nationally and locally and to insure the safety and security of any and all such efforts as may be related to said works, facilities and other projects, programs, locations and areas which may be subject to the activities of the Agency. Furthermore, to establish such training, housing and other facilities as may be needed within the Global Community Facilities, to create such training facilities as may be necessary for the purposes of physical and/or electronic issues of security concern and to staff said facilities in accordance with the purposes as set forth in the Agency Charter, Articles of Agreements and By-Laws.

(X) to establish a global infrastructure sufficient to allow for the equitable trade of goods and/or services among and between the individual nations of the world in such a manner so as to open global markets to any and all corporeal entities and to guarantee a system of fair and equitable trade in a global marketplace.

(XI) to establish a set of global Standard of Minimal Requirements for the purposes of housing, education, health and medical care, environmental concerns and for the provision of food and other basic necessities of life as may be needed to fully eradicate poverty and elevate the median Standard of Living for peoples around the globe.

(XII) to establish an International Body for the purposes of guaranteeing the transparency and effectiveness of any and all such programs as may be implemented of, for, by and on behalf of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency whether as a Special Agency of the United Nations or as a single and wholly separate and unique corporeal entity.

(XIII) to establish a Continent-based, value-based currency that does not utilize the principles of Debt-Based Economic System in order to insure that currency maintains, retains and sustains a more well-regulated and standard value locally, nationally and internationally and that current fluctuations in Global Market Prices and Currency Exchange Rates are minimized to facilitate a freer and more equitable system of trade Locally, Nationally and Internationally among all of the peoples of the world.

(XIV) to establish a Committee for the purchase and relief of Toxic Assets for individuals and/or Local and National Governing Bodies to insure that any Economic transitions that must naturally occur in such a process produce a minimal impact on the different Economic Systems in place at present. Furthermore, to utilize such Assets, Holdings and other Reserves as are currently available in order to offer more viable economic alternatives to the current efforts underway by the new Consortium of Nations known as BRICS where all Internal Trade is funded within a more closed economic system allowing for greater disparity in Currency Value and Exchange and creating disparity among the peoples of the world rather than creating a more Equitable, Global Financial structure.

(XV) to secure and equitably divide such assets as may be necessary to provide for the creation of a global value-based currency and to utilize said currency for the purposes of International Trade based on Actual Value so as to insure a more stable Global Marketplace and to maximize the ability of Individuals, Nations and Locales to trade on a Global level without creating any substantial fluctuation in Economic Market Value or Currency Exchange Rates.

ARTICLE 2 – MEMBERSHIP AND MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY

It should be noted that for the purposes of these Articles of Agreement, the Members and Membership Levels as described herein are not and should not be confused with the Diplomatic, Assembly and Committee Memberships as described in the Charter for the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency. The Membership Levels herein (As Noted in Article 2 and Article 5 of the Articles of Agreement) are noted in the Charter as Membership Levels within the section entitled "Organization and Structure of the Executive Corps" which works as a supplemental arm and "Support Staff" for the Secretary General. It is the responsibility of the Executive Corps and the Secretary General to guide and manage the General Assembly based on the most pressing Global Concerns at any given time.

ARTICLE 2-1 Original Members

The Original Members of The Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency shall be those who are members in good standing at the time of its Incorporation and other such members as may be integrated into the Agency from time to time at the sole discretion of the Original Members of the Agency in Accordance with the By-Laws and as per the Terms and Conditions as set forth by the Original Members.

ARTICLE 2-2 Board Members

Board Members shall be those members who are selected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency and serve as voting members of the Board of Directors to support and determine the role, efforts, future planning, program selection process and other efforts as may be needed including the formation of Committees, Sub-Committees, Sub-Agencies and such personnel and/or infrastructure as may be required to develop and implement the Agency. All Board Members serve at the discretion of the Original Members and as such may be subject to recall only in accordance with the By-Laws of the Agency.

ARTICLE 2-3 UN Members

Membership is automatically granted to any and all current members of the United Nations, its other Specialized Agencies and/or those who may be working in cooperation with the United Nations in order to fulfill its mission as stated in the United Nations Charter for the preservation of World Peace and the Health and Well-Being of all of the citizens of the world. Any Members of the UN may choose at any time to upgrade their Membership to a more desirable level in accordance with the By Laws and Charter of the Agency and/or at the discretion of the Chairman and/or by a vote of at least eighty-percent (80%) of the Executive Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 2-4 Other Members

"Other Members" shall be those whose membership fees are paid in full and who are by all accounts, Members in Good Standing of the Agency and whose goals, ideas and plans are in accordance with the Stated Purposes of the Agency as described in Article 1 of the Articles of Agreement and other such Articles as may be applicable.

ARTICLE 2-5 Membership Requirements

Membership to the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency will be available to any and all persons, companies, corporations and any other corporeal entity as may make contributions towards or maintain the status of Membership in Good Standing and maintain a concerted effort to follow the goals, practices and standards as set forth by the Agency Charter in accordance with the stated Purposes of the Agency. Additional Membership Opportunities shall be made available to groups such as National or Local Governments, Unions or other Groups whose stated goals and efforts seek to insure Global Peace and to eradicate poverty and to seek other solutions in accordance with the stated goals, objectives and purposes of the Agency.

ARTICLE 3 – MEMBERSHIP RENUNCIATION AND/OR MEMBERSHIP SUSPENSION

Such times and/or occurrences which may arise wherein members may wish to be willfully or be obligatorily removed from the Membership Roles of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency under such Terms and Conditions as described in Article 3.

ARTICLE 3-1 Willful Withdrawal of Membership

Any member of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency may willfully terminate their membership by providing thirty (30) days written notice to the Lawful and Authorized Department, Agent or Representative of the agency noting their intent to withdraw.

ARTICLE 3-2 Promotion of Violence

The Promotion of Violence may include (but is not necessarily limited to) the promotion of Acts of War, Terrorist Activity and/or any promotion of any Organized Acts of Violence for the purpose of over-throwing existing Governments and/or the Creation of Civil Unrest.

ARTICLE 3-3 Failure to Pay Dues

Any member may have their Membership Status revoked due to their failure to pay dues in accordance with their individual agreements. (Non-Dues-Paying Members may be exempted from this Article in accordance with the Terms and Conditions as set forth by the Agency and the Original Members)

ARTICLE 3-4 Failures of Obligation

Any member may have their Membership Status revoked for the failure to comply with any and all obligations, financial and otherwise, in accordance with their individual agreements and as to be decided by the Terms and Conditions as set forth by the Agency and/or the Original Members. Upon a completion of the Conditions of any and all Outstanding Obligations, former Members who have had their rights and privileges revoked may make a formal Appeal to the Original Members to have their Membership reinstated and their status changed back to Member in Good Standing in accordance with the Terms and Conditions as set forth by the Agency and the Original Members.

ARTICLE 3-5 Political Activism

While recognizing that each and every individual will hold, maintain and exercise their personal rights, liberties and freedoms and support that in which they believe, it shall not be for any Individual or any Entity to actively engage in the restructuring of or to serve to unduly impact the Politics of any Governing Body Locally, Nationally or Internationally. While the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency shall have a Political Arm by necessity, that Political Arm is to serve for the benefit of the Members and the Nations and the People of all Nations without regards to personal political beliefs. Any Member seeking to undermine accepted Political Activities and/or making any effort to claim or imply urging prejudiced Political Action on behalf of the Agency shall have their Membership considered Forfeit.

ARTICLE 3-6 Settlement of Accounts with Former Members

Any and All Members who renounce their Membership whether willfully or otherwise will be entitled to a full accounting of Outstanding Activities to include (but not necessarily to be limited to) any and all Outstanding Obligations and any and all Holdings, Accounts, Deposits and/or Investments of Record.

Article 3-6-1 Personal Accounts

Personal Accounts by and between the Former Member and any and all other Members and/or Former Members who may have agreements, contractual or otherwise shall remain Private and shall not be pursued by the Agency or its Members in any official capacity. Personal Accounts and Agreements whether contractual or otherwise shall remain Personal for any and all Members and/or Former Members of the Agency.

Article 3-6-2 Outstanding Obligations

Any Former Member who has forfeited their status as a Member in Good Standing willfully or otherwise shall remain legally bound by any and all Agreements Contractual and otherwise with, for and/or on Behalf of The Agency.

Article 3-6-3 Assets and Holdings of Former Members

Any and all Assets, Investments, Holdings and/or Financial Interests held by any Former Member who has forfeited their Membership willfully or otherwise will be eligible for a complete return of any and all cash/deposits within five (5) working days. Other Assets, Holdings and Financial Instruments of Former Members will be addressed within five (5) working days though closure and resolution will vary depending on the size, type and amount of Assets, Holdings and/or other Financial Instruments as determined by the current Market situation at the time of Forfeiture of Membership and in accordance with the ability to physically release such Assets, Holdings or other Financial Instruments and/or the ability to liquidate such Assets at said time.

ARTICLE 3-7 Forfeiture of Membership by Governing Bodies¹

Under the Terms and Conditions as set forth by the Agency and the Original Members, any Individual entity including any Governing Body has the right to Willfully Forfeit Membership or can have their Membership Status Forfeited under the circumstances as outlined in Article Three of the Articles of Agreement of the Agency. Due consideration will be given any and all Former Members who have Forfeited Membership whether willfully or not. In the case of larger Contributors and/or Investors as many Governing Bodies will be, Special Consideration will be needed and given upon the termination of Membership for whatever purpose said Membership was forfeited.

ARTICLE 3-7-1 Forfeiture of Membership by Governing Bodies without Outstanding Debts and/or Liabilities

In the case of Forfeiture of Membership by a Governing Body whether willful or otherwise, if there are no Lawful Debts and/or other Financial Obligations to the Agency, efforts will begin within five (5) working days to begin the process for a return of all Assets, Holdings and/or other Financial Instruments as may be held by the Agency.

ARTICLE 3-7-2 Forfeiture of Membership by Governing Bodies with Outstanding Debts and/or Liabilities

In the case of the Forfeiture of Membership by Governing Bodies whether willful or otherwise in the case where there are Outstanding Debts and/or Liabilities held by said Governing Body, its Agents, Agencies, Bureaus or other Entity as may be reasonably construed to be a part of, representative of or otherwise working in an official capacity for said Governing Body, a Review Board will commence within five (5) working days of Forfeiture of Membership. If any and/or all Assets, Holdings and/or Financial Instruments are sufficient to cover such debts, said debt shall be paid for from said Holdings with the remaining balance to be returned to the Governing Body as Market Conditions and other prevalent factors will allow and in accordance with the Terms and Conditions as set forth by the Agency and/or its Original Members.

ARTICLE 3-7-3 Forfeiture of Membership by Governing Bodies with Outstanding Debts and/or Liabilities larger than Holdings of Said Governing Body

In the event that any Governing Body forfeits their Membership whether willfully or otherwise, and said Governing Body, its Agents, Agencies, Bureaus or other Entity as may be reasonably construed to be a part of, representative of or otherwise working in an official capacity for said Governing Body has remaining Debts and/or other Obligations financial or otherwise, and said Debts and/or Obligations are larger than the Assets, Holdings and/or other Financial Holdings as may belong to said Governing Body, said Governing Body shall be required to pay on demand any and all Monies, Assets and/or Holdings up to the total amount of the Outstanding Debt or Obligation including any Interest and Penalties as have accrued as a result of failure to settle all Debts and Liabilities in a timely and agreeable fashion as per the existing Contracts of said Obligations.

ARTICLE 4 – ASSETS, HOLDINGS AND OTHER FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS OF THE GLOBAL INFRASTRUCTURE, DEVELOPMENT AND INTERNATIONAL FINANCE AGENCY

As with any Reserve or other Financial Institution, it is necessary to have, possess and control Assets, Holdings, Bonds, Currencies (Both Cut and Uncut) in order to preserve the value of any currencies as may be issued and/or regulated by such an Institution. To that end, these Assets and Holdings have been duly recorded as being Owned in accordance with International Treaties, International Accords and the International Chamber of Commerce and the United Nations in addition to all Laws both National and International.

ARTICLE 4-1 Gold, Bullion, Diamonds and other Precious Metals and Jewels

Be it duly noted that in accordance with the International Treaties implemented with the full cooperation of the United Nation and its Member States and recognized by National and International Law, Historical Proof of Ownership and all Legal Documentation as required by National and International Law, the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency has in its possession, physically or otherwise, the following Gold, Precious Metals and Jewels:

Article 4-1-2 Platinum

One-Million Metric Tons of Platinum

Article 4-1-3 Diamonds

ARTICLE 4-3 Obligations

Be it duly noted that in accordance with the International Treaties implemented with the full cooperation of the United Nation and its Member States and recognized by National and International Law, Historical Proof of Ownership and all Legal Documentation as required by National and International Law, the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency has in its possession, physically or otherwise, the following Obligations:

ARTICLE 4-4 Reserves and Reserve Amounts

In accordance with agreements reached and the Treaties signed, an amount of Sixty-Five Quadrillion Dollars (\$65,000,000,000,000,000,000,000) in Physical Assets and Holdings will back any and all new currencies as they are established. Funds have been established by a Cooperative Agreement between more than Twenty-Two-Thousand Corporate Entities including all manner of Business Interests.

ARTICLE-5 AGENCY STRUCTURE REGARDING MEMBERSHIP LEVELS

The Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency will by necessity have a Governing Board to promote the direction of business and to insure that the Purposes of the Agency are pursued as designed and not as interpreted by any single Individual or Entity no matter the size of their investment. Ultimate Approval and Veto Power will remain with the Agency Chairman but can be over-turned by a seventy-five percent (75%) vote if and when a Board Vote is called for by the Board of Directors under the Terms and Conditions as set forth by the Agency. For the purposes of these Articles of Agreement, the Chairman shall not be considered as an actual Member or placed and/or restricted to any Membership Level. Membership levels shall include Executive Board of Directors level Membership, Sovereign Membership Level, National Government level, Representative Level, Institutional Level, Corporate Level and the Individual Level.

It should be noted that for the purposes of these Articles of Agreement, the Members and Membership Levels as described herein are not and should not be confused with the Diplomatic, Assembly and Committee Memberships as described in the Charter for the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency. The Secretary General and Global Ambassador positions remain The Honorable Mr. Angel Ferdinand Marcos. The Membership Levels herein (As Noted in Article 2 and Article 5 of the Articles of Agreement) are noted in the Charter as Membership Levels within the section entitled "Organization and Structure of the Executive Corps" which works as a supplemental arm and "Support Staff" for the Secretary General. It is the responsibility of the Executive Corps and the Secretary General to guide and manage the General Assembly based on the most pressing Global Concerns at any given time.

ARTICLE 5-1 the Secretary General

The Secretary General is not designated as an actual Membership Level but as the Sole Executive Authority of the Agency should be represented in and among the Members of the Agency. All final decisions of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency shall be the sole decision of the Secretary General. The Executive Board of Directors shall make decisions and recommendations collectively though all votes shall be subject to the Final Decision of the Secretary General in accordance with the Terms and Conditions as set forth and established in the Agency By-Laws and Charter. Upon the Death and/or Mental Incapacitation of the Secretary General, his Heir and/or (an)other(s) as may be expressed in his Final Wishes, shall be rightfully appointed as the next Duly Designated Representative Secretary General and Global Diplomat of the Agency. In the event that such an Heir is not readily apparent and/or competent, the Executive Board shall collectively vote and decide upon the next Secretary General with a minimum vote of eighty percent (80%) of the Executive Board of Directors in concurrence with the decision and voting in its favor.

Article 5-2 the Executive Board of Directors

The Executive Board of Directors shall be established in accordance with the By-Laws and Charter as established and set forth by the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency and shall be answerable to both the Secretary General and to the Members of the Agency. Matters decided and Lawfully voted upon and passed by the Executive Board of Directors shall be brought forth in front of the General Assembly for further consideration.

Article 5-2-1 Executive Decisions and Voting Procedure for Program Implementation

The Executive Board of Directors of the Agency shall be required to vote on all matters regarding the pursuit, design and implementation of any and all projects and programs that conform to the purposes and goals of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Financial Agency. Any and all such votes must reach a seventy-five percent (75%) portion of the vote in order to be considered Passed or Resolved though the final Executive Action necessary for the implementation of any vote shall rest solely with the Secretary General as per the rules and procedures as established by the Agency in its bylaws and Charter.

Article 5-2-2 Matters to be Brought Forth for a Vote by the Executive Board

The Executive Board of Directors must vote on all matters brought before the Executive Board for such votes. The decision as to whether or not any individual cause, case, project and/or program may require a vote may be determined by Committee(s) and/or Sub-Committee(s) and/or the General Assembly as may be required given the vast number of such activities considered in the pursuit of the Stated Purposes of the Agency. Once brought before the Executive Board of Directors, all matters must be brought to a vote in a timely manner as set forth by the By Laws and Charter of the Agency. Staff members may be made available for such members of the Executive Board to work in cooperation with any and all Committee(s) and/or Sub-Committee(s) as may be required in the pursuit of goals in accordance with the stated Purposes of this Agency.

Article 5-2-3 Matters Brought Forth for Vote by General Members

General Members may from time to time be asked or required to vote on matters relevant to the pursuit of the Stated Purposes of the Agency. In such matters, Executive Board Members should by right of Collective Agreement vote in accord with the wishes as expressed by the Majority Vote from among their Constituents or those Members of the Agency in areas represented by the Member of the Executive Board of Directors

Article 5-2-4 Selection of Executive Board of Directors

The Selection Process for the Members of the Executive Board of Directors shall be such that each and every Governing Body (As Defined and Noted in Article 3-7 of these Articles of Agreement for the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency) has one (1) member on the Executive Board of Directors under the Limitations and Restrictions as Set Forth by the Agency in Accordance with the By Laws and Charter thereof. Additional Members of the Executive Board of Directors shall include the Lawful Representative and/or Delegate of any Membership Agreement at the Representative Level or above.

Article 5-2-5 Exemption from Duties on the Executive Board of Directors

Exemptions Must and Shall be applied in all cases where only Corporate and/or Individual Membership Dues have been requested by the Governing Body unless and until such a time as full Representative or above Membership Status is attained and/or Dues for the same are paid as mandated in the By Laws and Charter of the Agency. Additional Exemptions shall be made available to those who have paid full dues for the purposes of Governing Body Status but wherein undue hardship may be resultant from the absence or inability of the Individual and/or Governing Body should they be required to attend to duties elsewhere. Those Members who are eligible for Membership within the Executive Board of Directors may enjoy the option to appoint a Delegate to serve in their stead at the sole discretion of the Secretary General.

ARTICLE 5-3 Sovereign Level Membership and Members

The Sovereign Level of Membership is the highest level of Membership outside of the Executive Board of Directors though Sovereign Level Members may choose to represent themselves or have a Delegate to lawfully represent them on the Executive Board of Directors at the sole discretion of the Chairman. Sovereign Level Membership shall be restricted to those members with a sufficient investment in Reserves, Holdings and/or Financial Instruments to be physically and corporeally held in Agency Approved Facilities and/or after sufficient evidence and inspection has concluded and verified the existence and/or ownership of said Reserves, Holdings and/or other Financial Instruments to be held in other locations at the sole discretion of the Secretary General. Said Financial Instruments in any form shall be subject to Inspection as per the Agreements with the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency and as may be needed for Audits, Inspections and other occurrences in accordance with International Treaties, National and International Laws related to the issuance and regulation of Cash, Currency and Financial Instruments.

ARTICLE 5-4 National Government Level of Membership

At present, National Governments are relegated to utilizing the "Faith and Good Credit" method of currencies and not with a viable, asset-based economic system. The Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency will offer an Asset-Based currency system with safeties in place to insure the stability of Local and National Economies in times of change. As such, it will be wholly beneficial for Nations to unite behind such an Asset-based system and be actively represented in the Agency as it works to eradicate poverty and to enjoy the benefits of Agreements and/or treatises. National Governments shall enjoy Due Representation on the Executive Board of Directors and be a party to the treaties, negotiations and other efforts and pursuits in accordance with the Purposes of the Agency as set forth in these Articles of Agreement and its Charter. While no additional Voting Power or other special privileges shall be included with National Governmental Membership, there is a great deal of incentive (financial and otherwise) due to the ability to work and trade within an Asset-based economic system apart from the "Faith and Good Credit" with its weaknesses and constant fluctuations in currency evaluation. There is a requirement for and a direct benefit from the inclusion of Money and/or other Financial Instruments to be invested into the Central Reserve Facility of the Agency at this level of Membership.

ARTICLE 5-5 Kingdom Level of Membership

At the Kingdom Level of Membership, due and lawful Representation will be present on the Executive Board of Directors in the form of a Primary Member of the Kingdom and/or their Authorized and/or Designated Representative in accordance with the By-Laws and Articles of Agreement of the Agency. There is a requirement for and substantial benefit to the introduction of Money and/or other Financial Instruments as part of the overall Reserve of tangible assets of the Agency at this level of Membership participation.

ARTICLE 5-6 Institutional Level of Membership

The Institutional Level of Membership is included for the NGO who wants and/or needs representation on a Global level and whose goals, mission and vision match those of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Financial Agency and who are seeking to gain active representation on a very influential and powerful Board. Membership at this level does authorize the NGO and/or other Organization to have a Designated Representative on the Executive Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 5-7 Corporate Level Membership

The Corporate Level of Membership shall be the lowest level at which it is possible to have a Voting, Authorized Representative on the Executive Board of Directors. This level will require an annual Membership Fee but will not require any actual investment into the Agency, the Reserve or the Debt and Asset Relief programs of the Agency.

ARTICLE 5-8 Individual Level Membership

The Individual Level Membership is a way for even the smallest of Charities to become involved with what is going on. At this level, direct representation in the Executive Board of Directors may not be available but Individual Members will be able to vote in matters of general concern and to have their voices heard. It will also allow the Individual Member to become eligible for a great many of the other benefits from Membership including the opportunity to fund projects and programs that are in-line with the beliefs and purposes as stated herein and in the Charter of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency.

ARTICLE 5-9 Members of the United Nations as Eligible Members

All members of the United Nations in accordance with International Law and Treaties are eligible for Individual Membership though any and all Members of the UN may select to upgrade their Membership Status on an Individual Basis or at any Level as a Dues Paying Member meeting the qualifications of the desired Level of Membership in accordance with the By-Laws, Charter and Articles of Agreement of the Agency.

ARTICLE 6 – OPERATIONS OF THE GLOBAL INFRASTRUCTURE, DEVELOPMENT AND INTERNATIONAL FINANCE AGENCY

The operations of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency will be multi-faceted and focusing on the ultimate elimination of poverty throughout the world in addition to focusing on true Economic and Social Freedom for all of the peoples of the world. In order to accomplish this task, the primary focuses are on a centralized, asset-based economic system, proper health and medical care for all people, safe and secure housing, social, community and economic infrastructure development to meet the needs of all people, agricultural and environmentally sustainable technologies, viable, individualized educational opportunities, job and business opportunities and disaster mitigation and response. In order to facilitate the beginning of such an effort, it will be necessary to purchase and forgive debt at the local and national level as one of the primary stages of this operation. Only then will it be possible to implement a new economic order with an actual transfer of wealth and not merely a payment of debt with interest that will never cover the actual debt itself.

ARTICLE 6-1 Global Asset Relief Program

In order to facilitate a smooth economic transition from a debt-based, fractional economic system to a more equitable value-based and Gold and Bullion backed currency, it will be necessary to purchase any and all toxic assets of all Member Nations. The Global Asset Relief Program is designed to implement a new Economic system over the top of the older system allowing for all Member Nations to create a new, Debt-Free Economic system. Such a program may be extended to any and all members as deemed to be in accordance with the By Laws and Charter of the Agency and/or at the discretion of the Chairman and/or Eighty Percent (80%) of the Executive Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 6-2 Credit Distribution and Equitable Distribution of Wealth through Electronic and Digital Credit and Debit Cards

In order to comply with all of the relevant International Treaties and Agreements, it is necessary that the vast majority (or some seventy percent) of all monies from the Historical Assets and Holdings must be returned to the peoples of the world. In order to facilitate this movement while at the same time generating an additional stream for Positive Cash Flow, the provision has been made to distribute an initial run of seven-hundred and fifty million electronic and digital credit and debit cards to indigenous and impoverished people around the globe and/or to NGO and other Organizational Institutions working on their behalf. These cards are state-of-the-art cards with microchips and bio-data storage and the technology is such that it allows their uses to be restricted to the provision of food, housing, education, health and medical concerns and efforts to alleviate all of the above. These credit cards will be made available to those Members in good standing who can demonstrate a means to work for such goals in accordance with the Terms and Conditions as set forth by the International Treaties.

ARTICLE 6-3 Global Provision of Housing

One of the stated goals and purposes of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency is to end homelessness throughout the world. To that end, provisions have been made to facilitate the construction of some five-million homes around the globe. This initial construction will be carried out by Approved and Certified Contractors who have already been approved and vetted by the Original Members in such a way as to provide safe, secure and varied options for the homeless people of the world. Future efforts will include more housing with the addition of Holistic, Sustainable Community Development to provide the sociological, psychological and continued aid that some families who have suffered through multi-generational levels of poverty will need in order to once again become productive, contributing members of society.

ARTICLE 6-4 Global Initiative for the Provision of Laptops and Educational Aids

The lack of education can be directly connected to the conditions of generational poverty and other related issues such as homelessness, hunger and perhaps most devastating of all, the lack of any real opportunity to escape that poverty. To that end, Collaborative Efforts have been worked out with numerous Universities and Software Manufacturers for the distribution of seven-hundred and fifty laptops loaded with Distance Learning software whereas children will be able to learn in Distance Courses conducted by noted and proven Institutions of Education, software containing teaching and learning aids for individual students who do not have access to Internet Connections (until such infrastructure can be established) and other tools to aid in the provision of education to the impoverished peoples around the globe.

ARTICLE 6-5 Initiative for Infrastructure Development

The Infrastructure of a society is about much more than roads and bridges but it encompasses these as well. However it also means Public Works, Public Facilities and even Economic Structuring. As such, and since the Global Infrastructure is so relevant to Local, National and International well-being, it is a primary focus of the Agency.

Article 6-5-1 Economic Infrastructure

The Economic Infrastructure of any Economy, State, locality or even Nation is every bit as important to its people and its well-being. The Economic Engine is what will insure that roads are built, public buildings, roads, bridges and even utilities and Internet Connections. As such an integral part of any society, the Economic Infrastructure will be among the first projects to be completed by the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency. This will be completed by purchasing any and all Toxic Assets, bad debts and other Liabilities of the Members State and replacing them with an Asset-Based, valued currency system as opposed to the current Fractional, Debt-Based Economic System most commonly used by member states. Upon the successful purchase of any and all such Debts, Deficits and other Financial Obligations, arrangements can be made on a State by State basis for the implementation of new currencies or for the transition into a new backing system for the existing currency. Such activities shall include Financial Instruments such as (but not limited to) International Bills of Exchange, Stocks, Bonds, Bank Drafts, Bank Guarantees drawn upon the Central Sovereign Banking Facilities of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency.

Article 6-5-2 Transportation & Infrastructure to Include Roads, Highways & Bridges

Whether there is a National Trade Deficit or a National Trade Surplus, Roads, Highways and other means of transport and transportation are vital to the opportunity for any and all Member Nations to trade in and amongst one another and to continue trade as may be applicable and/or beneficial within the Member State and with the other Nations around the Globe. As such, it is imperative to the Global Effort to end Poverty that these means of transport and transportation remain open and free from obstruction or other obstacles that would prevent the Free Exercise of Trade within and/or Member States and other Nations around the World.

Article 6-5-3 Community Infrastructure to include Public Buildings

Schools, Public and Government Offices, Libraries, Schools and other Public Structures are imperative to a people if they are to be capable of self-governance. To that end, the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency will be renovating older buildings where such redevelopment is possible and building new facilities where none exist and/or where those buildings that may exist could not be rebuilt without the need for excessive amounts of funding.

Article 6-5-4 Community Infrastructure to include Public Utilities

Clean Water, proper Drainage and Sewage and an adequate level of power generation are not unreasonable demands or wholly impossible to accomplish. Member Nations will receive direct aid and assistance in the implementation of power structures to include Fuel Cell Technology, Solar Power, Blade-less Wind Power and may be used for the purposes of testing other alternative methods for power generation in accordance with the efforts to address and rectify environmental concerns and issues that the world is currently facing.

Article 6-5-5 Infrastructure to Include Waterways and Water Transport

Whether dredging rivers, building bridges or insuring that waterways are clean and safe for National and International Trade and often an integral part of Domestic Trade as well. To that ends and with the related environmental issues in mind, programs have been established to create, clear, clean and enhance existing waterways in such a manner as to facilitate the cleaning and enhancement of existing waterways in addition to the creation of new waterways as may be prudent in accordance with the Stated Purposes of the Agency.

Article 6-5-6 Infrastructure to Include Internet and other Communications Utilities

Satellite and Wireless Networks may seem out of place in some of the more rural environments around the globe but that is exactly where they are needed the most. Due to the Distance Learning Programs, the need to connect schools and individuals with teachers and other educators around the globe and the need for Governmental Agencies and other Financial Institutions to have instant and immediate access to Funds, Monies and/or other Financial Instruments as may be necessary to conduct the everyday affairs of business and governance, Internet Access is more than a mere luxury. Programs will be implemented in all Member States and in accordance with the many concerns and efforts of the Agency.

Article 6-5-7 Infrastructure Security and Stabilization

The Security and Stabilization of any and all institutions, structures, buildings and/or any other facilities as may be necessary for the provision of infrastructure cannot be underestimated or discounted. Member States shall be initially responsible for the safety of any and all aspects of National Infrastructure though there may be occasions when extenuating circumstances prevent the same. Should Member States be incapable of providing their own troops, police and/or other forces as may be needed to secure the Infrastructure, Security Forces from the Agency may be called upon as needed to insure the safety of said Infrastructure.

ARTICLE 6-6 Educational Initiatives to include Universities

While some Member Nations and other Governmental Bodies may wish to include University Campuses replete with some sixteen colleges already in place to date, it may be beneficial for many of the Institutional Level Members as well. As with the K-12 and other school programs and projects, the most unique feature of these programs will be the lack of a need for local teachers though local classroom monitors are highly recommended. Many of the finest institutions in the world are working together to put together comprehensive and unique curricula for a wide and diverse range of courses up to and including doctoral degree programs in order to provide global skill sets to people from around the world who have to compete in an increasingly Global Society.

ARTICLE 6-7 Integrated Cooperative Communities and Social Infrastructure and Aid for Housing, Sociological Assistance and Scholastic and Vocational Training

There is a vast majority of the more impoverished people around the globe who have lived in virtual bondage for generations. It is unfathomable to believe that these families who have lived in the chains of poverty for so long will be able to fully integrate back into society on their own regardless of their new, improved, personal financial standings. As such, central communities are being built around the globe but not in the more traditional way where it is scarcely more than a single, hovel to hide away and isolate the poor and underclass citizens. These will be revolutionary and Cooperative communities whereby the individual benefits from the success of the community as a whole. The community will be a mixed-community insofar as there will be sociologists, educators, psychologists, medical facilities and an isolated grid for environmentally friendly and sustainable technologies powering the entire community. It will contain a very diverse conglomeration of Profit and Not-for-Profit ventures all under the umbrella of a single Institution. The For-Profit ventures will provide vocational training for the adults providing for an immediate relief from poverty while the children will be provided with both vocational and scholastic education.

ARTICLE 6-8 Economic and Social Freedom and Justice

While it has been the intent of a great many nations during the time of their formations to allow for Economic and Social Freedom in addition to an equitable and "fair" Justice System, such has rarely stayed in place for very long. The system established by the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Foundation provides for a unique system that will provide for a more equitable distribution of wealth including definitive rewards financially and otherwise for those that are more motivated while at the same time providing a cushion for the underclass in the form of social and economic justice that, while it may not actually reward the lack of incentive on the part of some people, neither does it leave them bound, impoverished, homeless and hungry.

ARTICLE 6-9 Financial Role of Central Asset Reserve and Global Debt Facility

The current Global Economic System is unsustainable at its current levels and cannot be expected to remain a viable Economic System without a continual rate of growth which is increasingly less likely as the global economy weakens further. To that end, the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Organization shall establish itself as a means to grant true economic freedom to the peoples of the world. In order to initiate such a change, it will be necessary to completely restructure the methods of Economies, their functions and a viable system for Economic Reformation that avoids the potential for Economic Turmoil during any periods of Global Economic Reform.

ARTICLE 7 – GLOBAL DEBT FACILITY, BANKS AND OFFICES

The Global Debt Facility shall be located in a safe and secure location as selected by the Original Members and the Chairman. It shall further be protected by the Security Forces of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency. The Banks shall be located in such locations as where there are existing members in addition to at least one (1) member who is on the Executive Board of Directors and whose contributions to the Global Debt Facility are sufficient to meet any and all Financial Obligations of said Bank. Offices shall be located in such locations as may be necessary to coordinate the transactions between Banks, allow for the safe and secure transportation of Assets and Financial Instruments and as selected and./or approved by the Executive Board of Directors and the Chairman.

ARTICLE 8 – RELATIONSHIPS WITH MEMBERS, MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS AND NON-MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS

For the purposes of General Banking, only Members of any Level shall be eligible to participate within the constraints of this agreement including Member Organizations and any and all Member Governing Bodies. Any and all Transactions conducted with Non-Members and/or Non-Member Organizations must be conducted only after explicit approval by and from the Executive Board of Directors and the Chairman.

ARTICLE 9 – MEMBERS AND LOCAL CURRENCIES

The Local Banks and the Global Debt Reserve Central Facility shall accept from any member any part of the member's currency in the General Resources Account which in accordance with the By Laws and Charter of the Agency is not necessary for its day-to-day operations and/or transactions, notes or any other similar obligations as may be issued by the member or the depository designated by the member under Article XIII, Section 2, which shall be non-negotiable, non-interest bearing and payable at their face value on demand by crediting the account of the Fund in the designated depository. This Section shall apply not only to currency subscribed by members but also to any currency otherwise due to, or acquired by, the Agency and to be placed in the General Resources Account of the Central Debt Facility and/or local Banks in accordance with the terms of the Charter and By Laws of the Agency.

ARTICLE 10 – VARYING CURRENCIES WITHIN SINGLE FACILITIES

Any and all currencies shall be deemed to apply to the separate currencies of all territories in respect of which the member has accepted an agreement with and/or membership of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency unless the member declares that its action relates either to the local currency alone, or only to one or more specified separate currencies without any influence on outside and/or additional units of currency, or to the local exchange and one or more specified separate currencies.

ARTICLE 11 – LOAN ACTIVITIES BETWEEN THE GLOBAL DEBT RESERVE AND RESERVE LOCATIONS AND/OR OTHER MEMBERS

One of the stated purposes of the Agency is to provide for such financial backing as may be necessary to facilitate fair and equitable trade among members and even non-member individuals and/or organizations. As such, the following shall be the precedent for the Financial Transactions between the Central Global Debt Relief Facility and/or Local Branches of the Facility and/or Members at any level of Membership.

ARTICLE 11-1 The Ability of the Global Debt Facility and its Local Counterparts to Loan and Borrow Funds

The Bank may make or facilitate loans in any of the following ways:

Article 11-1-1 Local Branches and Loans on the Central, Global Debt Facility

By making or participating in direct loans out of its own funds corresponding to its unimpaired paid-up capital and surplus and, subject to Section 6 of this Article, to its reserves.

Article 11-1-2 Local Facilitation of Loans

By making or participating in direct loans out of funds raised in the market of a member, or otherwise borrowed by the Bank.

ARTICLE 11-2 Local Facilitation of Borrowing

Article 11-2-1 Borrowing for Members and Local Exchanges of the Global Debt Relief Facility

The bank may borrow only with the approval of the member in whose markets the funds are raised and the member in whose currency the loan is denominated, and only if those members agree that the proceeds may be exchanged for the currency of any other member without restriction.

Article 11-2-2 Borrowing for Non-Members and Non-Member Organizations

In cases where loans may be requested for Non-Members and/or Non-Member Organization, an eighty percent vote by the Executive Board of Directors and/or the Approval of the Chairman is required.

ARTICLE 12 – REGARDING FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS OTHER THAN LOANS

Each Member of any Level shall deal with their Local Branch of the Global Debt Facility except in cases where such a local facility may not be readily accessible, completed or otherwise available at that time. At such a time as there are a sufficient number of Members (at any Membership Level) in any centralized location, in accordance with the By Laws and the Charter of the Agency and with an Eighty-Percent vote in favor of such action by the Executive Board of Directors and/or at the sole discretion of the Chairman, Local Debt Relief Institutions may be constructed in order to accommodate the large number of Members in such a locale.

ARTICLE 12-1 Individual Member Fund's Financial Transactions

Except as otherwise provided in these Articles of Agreement, the Agency By Laws and the Agency Charter, Individual Member Transactions shall be conducted on the following terms:

Article 12-1-1 The Right of Financial Withdrawal

The account of the Fund shall be limited to transactions for the purpose of supplying a member, on the initiative of such member, with Special Rights of Withdrawal of the currencies from the general resources of the Fund which shall be held in the General Resources Funds as allocated by the local Debt Relief Facility in exchange for the currency of the member stored in such Facility.

Article 12-1-2 The Right of Financial Deposit

Any and all members shall have the right to deposit in their Local Debt Relief Facility utilizing Local Currencies for purposes of Savings, Bank Drafting and/or for the payment of Obligations to the Local Debt Relief Facility with such funds only to be utilized by the Local Debt Facility in accordance with the Purposes of the Agency and primarily for the Benefit of the locale wherein said Facility may be located as would be common with any Financial Institution. All monies deposited shall be payable in local currencies though Currency and Asset Exchange Programs may be made available by said Facility though additional fees may apply.

Article 12-1-3 Guarantee of Depositor Assets

All Assets, Currencies and other Financial Instruments as may be deposited in the Local Debt Relief Facility shall be backed and guaranteed by the Central, Global Debt Relief Facility with an actual, physical and corporeal reserve in the amount of Sixty-Five Quadrillion Dollars. (\$65,000,000,000,000,000.000)

Article 12-1-4 Interest and/or Profits Gained from Deposited Currencies

Any such interest and/or profits gained by the Local Debt Relief Facility from investments made in accordance with the By Laws and Charter of the Agency in addition to any and all investments as have been made by the Local Debt Relief Facility into local economies can and shall be secured in a Reserve Operational Fund and used for the purpose of paying for any and all liabilities incurred as a direct result of normal business operations. Such funds as may be counted as a "Surplus Amount" in this Reserve may from time to time reach a level sufficient enough to warrant Deposits into the Global Debt Relief Facility or may be kept and stored in the Local Facility as mandated by the Executive Board of Directors and/or the Chairman.

ARTICLE 13 – REGARDING LEGAL RESOLUTION OF DISPUTE, IMMUNITY AND DIPLOMATIC STATUS

The Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Organization, as a matter of being a Special Agency working in cooperation with and in the constraints of the Code of Conduct of all United Nations Members, special status may apply to certain transactions and dealings of the Agency regarding highly sensitive issue of National and International Security and National and International Finance and as such, requires Special Diplomatic Status for some of its personnel in addition to Special Regulatory and Legislative Consideration regarding the Business interests of the Agency.

ARTICLE 13-1 Diplomatic Status and Diplomatic Immunity

Any and all persons as may be dealing Nationally and Internationally solely for the purposes of conducting business by, for and/or on behalf of The Global Debt Facility shall receive, be accorded with and held to the standards of Full Diplomatic Immunity during the course of their work on behalf of the Agency. Such Diplomatic Immunity will be granted to the Chairman of the Agency, to all Members who are Members of the Executive Board of Directors in good standing with the Agency and to all Original Members of the Agency. As circumstances may occasionally change in more fluid environments, special arrangements may be made or as extenuating circumstances may require the issuance of Temporary Diplomatic Status to be conveyed upon an Individual or Group at the sole discretion of the Chairman.

ARTICLE 13-2 Resolution of National and International Juridical Dispute

In Juridical Matters, the Agency shall retain the right to freely trade, exchange, transport and work as it may be necessary with Historical Assets and/or other items covered by International Treaties and/or International Law. As such, the Agency retains the lawful right to move these "immovable" objects, trade, exchange and otherwise deal in these Historical Assets and/or other Financial Instruments as may be deemed necessary by and for the Agency by the Executive Board of Directors and/or the Chairman. The Agency may not be held accountable by Local Laws presuming to be used to supersede International Laws nor will International Law apply when such transactions involve only the Agency, its Members and/or any representative who may be reasonably be construed to be working in full cooperation with and/or on behalf of the Agency.

ARTICLE 13-3 Resolution of National and International Judicial Dispute

Actions may be brought against the Bank only in a court of competent jurisdiction in the territory of the Global Debt Facility has an office, has appointed an agent for the purpose of accepting service or notice of process, and/or has issued or guaranteed securities. No actions shall, however, be brought by members or persons acting for or deriving claims from members. The property and assets of the Bank in any location and in the possession of any Member lawfully representing the Agency, be immune from all forms of seizure, attachment or execution until and unless the rendering of a final judgment against the Bank and all avenues of appeal have been exhausted.

ARTICLE 14 – ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE FOR FULFILLMENT OF PURPOSE

In order to fulfill the goals, purposes and mission of the Agency, an organizational structure is necessary for the proper management of efforts in addition to the efficient allocation of tasks and responsibilities. That in order to fulfill these responsibilities, a system of Organization and Governance must be established and said Governance shall be established as is described herein:

Secretary General and Global Ambassador

The Secretary General and Global Ambassador is the Honorable Mr. Angel Ferdinand Marcos. The Secretary General shall set forth the programs, projects, goals and any other functions of GIDIFA as may be necessary to insure that the people of the world continue to enjoy Social and Economic Freedom. The Secretary General in his role as Global Ambassador shall enjoy the benefits and be bound by the rules of Diplomatic Immunity on a Global Level.

General Assembly

The General Assembly is a body of Two-Hundred Heads of State, Former Heads of State and other Socio-Political Experts in the field of Global Politics. The General Assembly shall be the body responsible for voting on any and all new regulations in accordance with the Charter, By-Laws and Articles of Agreement of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency. All Members of the General Assembly of the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency shall enjoy the benefits and be relegated to Global Diplomatic Immunity in accordance with International Law, International Treaties and the Legal and Binding decisions of the World Courts.

Committees

Committees are formed in order to study and evaluate the problems of the world we live in. Each committee shall be comprised of experts in any given field and as such, they will be in a position to make recommendations and suggestions in regards to resolutions to rectify existing problems and to alleviate them in part or in whole as the recommended procedures are implemented and programs are carried out for the ultimate demise of detrimental issues of Global, National and Local concern. Committee Members may enjoy the benefits and be relegated to the responsibilities of Diplomatic Immunity only if on official business and then only if approved by the Secretary General.

Sub-Committees

As many of the problems facing the world today are multi-faceted, complex issues requiring a very large, integrated and complex solution for long-term and effective results, it may be necessary to implement Sub-Committees for the purposes of identifying, isolating and/or rectifying individual aspects of overly complex subjects. Sub-Committee Chair-persons shall report directly to the Committee that has appointed them and shall be responsible for working in cooperation with and in compliance with the prerequisites as set forth by the Originating Committee as defined in the Parameters of the Exercise.

Staff and Support Personnel

Staff and Support Personnel shall be provided on an as-needed basis. Staff and Support Personnel will only enjoy the benefits of and be subjected to the restrictions of Diplomatic Immunity at such times as they may be working directly for any other Member who is by position granted such immunity. At such times as support staff and personnel do have Diplomatic Immunity, it shall only be during such a time as they are actually performing their job functions by and/or for the Senior Member who has Full Global Diplomatic Immunity.

Security Forces

Such Security Forces as may be needed to insure the adequate security of any and all facilities as may be utilized by the Global Infrastructure, Development and International Finance Agency shall be temporarily and/or permanently based in such locations wherein those facilities are physically located. Additional Security Forces shall be used to secure any and all facilities associated in any way with GIDIFA. Such Security Personnel shall enjoy the benefits and bear the responsibilities of Diplomatic Immunity only while on duty and/or during working hours working solely for GIDIFA.

ARTICLE 15 – INTERPRETATION OF ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

It may occur from time to time that such Articles of Agreement as these may come into question and/or be questioned. In the event of such circumstances, all matters of Question and Concern shall be brought forth before the Executive Board of Directors and brought to a vote upon a decision. If so approved by the Chairman, such interpretation as may be needed will be inserted into these Articles of Agreement as a portion of a new Amended version with a new Revision Number.
